

GENERAL INFORMATION

Paediatric Epilepsy Training Level 3 has been designed primarily for paediatric neurologists but would also be relevant to paediatricians who are providing tertiary epilepsy services.

The PET3 courses will aim to cover the whole spectrum of childhood epilepsy over a 4 year period. This sixth course will be a series of updates, controversies and workshops covering the themes of: IGE, Benign epilepsy syndromes, neurobiology, pharmacology, trials and epidemiology.

As well as didactic lectures from an eminent international faculty, there will be two formal debates on controversial issues and small group workshops. The emphasis of the meeting will be on discussion and participation of delegates.
